## **VICTORIAN AGRICULTURAL SHOWS (VAS LTD)**

### Competition Regulations

1. A person can represent only one Society / Group for VAS Ltd
2. An article having won at Show level will compete at Group Final; winner will then compete at next Royal Melbourne Show. A committee member will contact any eligible exhibitors prior to the competition to arrange the details of entering and collecting exhibits. The show committee cannot accept responsibility for exhibits outside of these parameters.
3. An article having won Group Final cannot compete further until after the Royal Melbourne Show.
4. An article having won at the Royal Melbourne Show in any class is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
5. Each entry must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
6. If for any reason the winner is unable to compete at Group or State final level, then the second-Place getter is eligible to compete.
7. Items, except Cookery exhibits, must be the same as won at local Show or Group.
8. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
9. An article having won first at a show cannot be shown at any other state show that year. All work to have been completed within the last 12 months.

## **WIMMERA AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES ASSOCIATION (WASA)**

### Competition Regulations

1. A person having won at a local Show will compete at a Wimmera Group final in November. A committee member will contact any eligible exhibitors prior to the competition to arrange the details of entering and collecting exhibits. The show committee cannot accept responsibility for exhibits outside of these parameters.
2. A person having won at Show level, is not eligible for entry at any other show until after the Group judging when, if not the winning entry, can compete again.
3. Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
4. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group Final, then second placegetter is eligible to compete.
5. WASA entrants must reside in the boundaries of the Wimmera Group.
6. Winners at WASA Group Final receive \$25 cash.
7. Items, except Cookery Exhibits which are entered in the Wimmera final judging must be exactly the same as won at local Show.

## **VAS RICH FRUIT CAKE RECIPE**

### **INGREDIENTS**

Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce

- 250g sultanas
- 250g chopped raisins
- 250g currants
- 125g chopped mixed peel
- 90g chopped red glace cherries
- 90g chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g plain flour
- 60g self-rising flour
- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g butter
- 250g soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
- 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs

**METHOD** Please note: there has been an update to the method to include: "Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces"

1. Cut the fruit & almonds into 3-4 pieces and mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
3. Place the mixture into a prepared tin 20 cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

## **VAS JUNIOR BOILED FRUIT CAKE RECIPE INGREDIENTS**

Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce

- 375g (12oz) Mixed Fruit
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice
- 1/2 cup water
- 125g (4oz) butter
- 1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- 1/2 cup sherry
- 2 eggs lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons marmalade
- 1 cup self-raising raising flour
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

### **METHOD**

1. Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water, and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda, and allow to cool.
3. Add the sherry, eggs, and marmalade, mixing well.
4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.
5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

### **VAS CARROT CAKE RECIPE INGREDIENTS**

- 375g plain flour
- 2tsp baking powder
- 1 ½ tsp bicarb soda
- 2tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- ½ tsp allspice
- Pinch of salt
- 345g castor sugar
- 350ml vegetable oil
- 4 eggs
- 3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams)

- 220g tin crushed pineapple, drained
- 180g pecan nuts coarsely crushed

#### METHOD

1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple, and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
3. Bake for approximately 90 - 100 minutes.
4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.
5. Cake can be presented on a cake board.

#### **VAS JUNIOR CARROT & SULTANA MUFFINS RECIPE INGREDIENTS**

- 2 1/2 cups self-raising flour
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)
- 1/3 cup chopped ½ sultanas
- 1 cup coarsely grated carrot
- 1 tablespoon orange marmalade
- 1 cup canola oil
- 2 eggs lightly beaten
- 3/4 cup orange juice
- 1 cup reduced fat milk.

#### METHOD

1. Pre-heat oven to 190C (moderately hot).
2. Line a 12-hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases - size (35mm height x 90mm wide x 50mm base)
3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl, stir in dates and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice, and milk. Mix until just combined.
4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases
5. Cook for 20 minutes. to test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer, if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.
6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.

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
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


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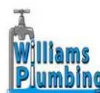
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
